Local Meet


On Saturday 17 March I drove about 30 miles to a local VMCC Meet (the British old bike club) and took an outside stand in order to hand out flyers for our own AMCA Meet. After a couple of hours standing in a snowstorm, this was the view of the stand next door:



The parts were covered in snow, a blizzard was blowing into my van, and all my flyers were getting soggy. I crept back home with the gritter trucks and thought you need to be a little crazy to get into old motorcycles.

UK Pioneer Run

Next day, Sunday 18 March, was the Pioneer Run of 350 pre-1915 motorcycles from London to Brighton. I was up at 05.30 to drive to the start, only to hear warnings that there was danger to life in going out on the roads that day. As I was a spectator rather than an entrant, I decided discretion was the better part of valour and stayed in. I found out that the start at Epsom racecourse was snowed in, so about 100 brave souls on veteran belt drive machines started at the Pease Pottage lunch stop, about half way, and managed to make it safely to the finish. What was I saying about craziness? Here are couple of pictures from the 2017 run that I didn't use last time.

European Chapter International Meet

We have an Export Green theme, and I can exclusively reveal that the National have done us proud and provided meet badges in a lovely dark green colour. We are expecting to see the two surviving export green Harley knuckleheads, the 1936 that we believe won the International Six Days Trial that year, and the 1937 that was the last American bike sold in Austria before WW2. These two original paint bikes have never been seen together before, so come and feast your eyes on this unrepeatable exhibition!

Details are on our Website at www.amca-europe.eu and you can be sure of a warm welcome. The on-site hotel is already full, but there are other hotels in town, and camping facilities not far away.

To our UK members, we had a very modest attendance last year, and Brexit may mean we need passports and border formalities next year, so please make the effort to soak yourself in American bikes and the company of like minded individuals early in the show season.

For our American friends, this is the time for that bucket list trip to visit the British Royal Wedding the weekend before, then come on to Raalte to bug out at those original paint export knuckles. I'm hoping we have a cover picture for the AMCA magazine, plus an interesting article, plus some great photos for the 2019 AMCA Calendar, so come along and be part of the event.

If you want to put a bike in for **judging**, there is still time to enter it on the main AMCA Website for \$10, but paying 20 euros on the day as a late entry is not a problem. If it is not a Harley or an Indian, then please let Pete Reeves know so that we can find qualified judges to give your bike the attention it deserves.

We shall be having a **raffle** again, to contribute to the cost of putting on this event, so please bring along unwanted parts, accessories, souvenirs etc to donate to our Chapter.

Once again we shall be having free entry, but again all visitors will be encouraged to donate for a **goody bag**, which will be even more full of good stuff than last time.

There is the American Motorcycle Museum on site, two restaurants, refreshments from the hotel, live music, a tented area even though I have been told the weather will be excellent, a ride out, a talk on older bikes, trade stands with practically 100% US bike parts, the chance to join judging teams with some real experts, and of course our **annual Chapter Meeting** at 17.30 on Friday. Agenda will be President's Report, election of officers, date of next meeting, and any other business. All our existing Directors have said they are prepared to serve another one year term, but we are always looking for fresh talent, so please let me know if you would like to help the European Chapter in some way. The Directors will arrive on Thursday to help set up, so I hope to see you there for another great event!

Tech Tip

Vice President Chris Bastiaansen gave me this great tip in a recent telephone call. If your four cylinder engine is tight after rebuild, slacken the engine mounting bolts and see if it gets looser. If it does, you need to adjust the mounting bolt shims into the frame.
