

AMCA EUROPEAN CHAPTER NEWSLETTER "Having fun with old motorcycles"

Hello AMCA Europe Members,

This month we have reports of new bikes in members garages, a membership update, a few words on the big Mecum auction, and a reminder of our May Meet in Raalte.

What's in the Garage?

From Chris Simmons, UK

This is my 1925 Indian Scout Cut-down 37ci. I bought two basket cases from Calvin Jones at Phoenix back in 2009. A '26 Wall of Death bike and a '25 stock. I pulled the best of the two together to build this bike and put the other to the side.



I handed the bike to Benny Thomas, then of Boneshaker Choppers, now of Mutt Motorcycles based in Birmingham who worked on the overall design and fabrication- my brief was I wanted it to be inspired by the Harley JDH cutdowns - the first of the custom bobber/hotrods of the 1930s. The motor went off to Joe at Blueprint Engineering in Wolverhampton. The seat is a wooden plate racing replica from Saddleworks in the US. The magneto went to Tony Leenes' brother Theodoor in Holland and the paint and gold leaf was laid down by Keith Baker of Classic Cycleworks in Horsham. Roll on a few years of collecting parts (ebay/Walker Machine/Pelders amongst others), dealing with 'many' issues and it finally was returned to me in one piece in early 2016. But in ran like a dog's dinner so in despair I took it to Robin at RTO Engineering in Folkestone who split the cases (slagged everything off

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in true Robin style) and rebuilt the engine again plus straightening the frame and forks and fixing the rockers and leaky tank. Started her and rode her properly in July 2016 with a big smile on my face. It was a long time coming but worth it.



In the parts stash was an old number plate which through the rust I guessed at the number FF2426 and with the help of Mike Worthy from Old Bike Mart I sent an enquiry to Gwynedd Council in Wales with the engine number. It was first registered in 1927 by Hugh Llewelyn Williams so I recovered and registered it on the original plate. Result!

The Wall bike was also worked on in the intervening period by John and Steve at Roadstar in Dover but by the time the '25 was built I was skint and had let the '26 go to Steve at Roadstar. Maybe one day she will get back on the wall.... [Editor: This project bike is still for sale]



And here is my (Steve's, UK) latest acquisition, a 1914 Douglas 348 cc fore-and-aft flat twin with a

Pioneer Run eligibility certificate for the run in October.



It's a belt drive machine with no clutch, but with a two speed gearbox. It is started by running alongside, or paddling from the saddle, in gear with the valve lifter up, then dropping the lifter lever. It is early enough to still have a Bosch magneto. The bike runs on the smoky side, so is now up on the bench being checked over. Douglas and Triumph were the most produced British bikes pre-WW1, with many then being used as dispatch rider mounts in France. This one has a frame number in the 16,000s, reaching 40,000 by 1918 after production mostly for the military.

The model continued until the late 1920s, by then marketed as a utility runabout. This machine is fitted with accessory acetylene lighting, which I do not plan to recommission. You can see the bike at our Raalte Meet in May, where our theme is still 'Bikes from the Teens'.

Membership

Our Chapter membership at the beginning of March was 324, so congratulations to all our Country Ambassadors for retaining and increasing our membership during a long dry spell. I now see a report on renewals and am gratified to see so many long term members staying with us. If you have trouble navigating the Website renewal process just let one of us know, as we have the fallback of Keith Kizer sending you a PayPal request. And don't forget

that two and three year memberships save money and potential renewal hassle.

We have gained members in Italy but lost two long term members. **Ferdy van Rijn** died aged 87 in December after a bicycle accident:



Ferdy was for 50 years the Harley marque specialist for the Dutch Veteran Bike Club, and was still riding his 1916 model 100 km at age 85. He hardly missed an AMCA Meet, and always brought interesting bikes and parts for us to see.

Uwe Illgner was also a fixture at our Meets:



He died in Brazil in January, setting out on a journey through Patagonia. We have reports on his long rides through South America in earlier newsletters, and his trip to Peru was a forerunner to the Enrique Pontolillo book he is seen with in the picture. That Indian sidecar outfit of his had 100,000 km of happy riding on it, so he went out doing something he loved.


However, we have gained five new members in Italy, plus two existing ones as follows:

Mecum Vegas Auction

The Internet will show you the results of about 1300 motorcycles going under the hammer, with a high percentage sold of models of all years and marques. It looks like buyers had been saving up their money and were back with a vengeance. There were no more \$2000 Harley Sportsters this time, but several knuckleheads fetching over \$100k and Indian and Henderson fours more like \$125k. Even Harley two strokes and the 1926-34 B, C and D models were fetching good money. A few Topper scooters found new owners, with record breaking prices for the old JD pocket valve Harleys and the 1930s VL flatheads. I saw two Zundapp K800 flat fours sold, with the Vincent market apparently softening slightly for non-Shadows. Early racers and eight valves with no provenance were easing, but even minor makes with

no reserve will still fetch good prices if finding two buyers bidding in competition.

Raalte Meet

Just a reminder that our European AMCA Meet will be held at the American Motorcycle Museum in Raalte, Netherlands on May 27/28. We have had the last two meetings cancelled, so missed our 20th anniversary but should be ready to celebrate our 21st. The theme remains 'Motorcycles from the Teens' but all machines 35 years old or more are welcome. The on-site hotel is already fully booked, so try De Zwaan in town or other local hotels and camp sites.
