From July 14 to 20 we had a great time during our Black Forest Road Run. A good variety of members from Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain and UK came to ride the wonderful routes through the Black Forest, guided by our local member Daniel Bruno. We counted 22 vintage bikes, including a RL, a VL as well as some Flatheads, Knuckles, Panheads and Shovelheads. All in all we had 5 riding days with a total of about 1,000 kms.

For the whole week the group was stationed in a typical Black Forest Hotel and on the evenings we had the chance to sit together and talk some shop. We enjoyed the great video showing our members Cristiano, Fabio and Luca from the Langhe Hills Chapter Italy during their Cannonball experience in the US last year.

IWKR England 03/04 August

The 38th International West Kent Run organised by the British VMCC took place on the Saturday, with a short 72 mile and long 104 mile run. It is based at an old Carmelite monastery near Maidstone, with grassy grounds, camping, accommodation, food and drink available. The site is about 40 miles from the Channel ports, so accessible from the Continent as the name suggests. The run was well marshalled and signposted and civilised in the English fashion. We rode for about an hour through country lanes, stopped for coffee, another 90 minutes then lunch in a stately home, then another 90 minutes riding and back for tea. I was on the 1954 Nimbus, low geared and flexible and suited to the modest speeds. It was a warm dry day and we saw oast houses, hump-backed bridges, single track roads, fields, trees and animals. There were 290 entrants, including visitors from Switzerland, France, Netherlands, Austria and Germany, and I think everyone made it round. Recommended.

The Sunday was for the swap meet, field games and prizes, and there were probably 500 bikes in the showground. I'd followed this 1914 Motosacoche engined Matchless on the Road Run, fitted with a water-cooled machine gun in the sidecar.



There were single-make Club stands from many British marques, including Kent-based Norman who built mostly Villiers engined bikes 1937-63.



The Indian Club managed to show seven bikes, including this 1922 Chief, plus a tasty 'teens Excelsior.



There were numerous Velocettes present, plus these two 1930s Rudges, a Rapid and an Ulster:

For the concours judging these visiting French Terrot and Alcyon bikes took the prizes:



If you want to make a week of it, there are social runs Thursday, Friday and Monday, with some evening entertainment as well. The next one is 02/03 August 2025.
