Hello AMCA Europe Members,

This time we have reports on the Cannonball Run, beach racing in Normandy, the UK Pioneer Run, Denton AMCA Meet and a visit to Wheels Through Time museum.

Cannonball Run

You will remember that last time, after the Black Hills Road Run, we left Olivier Blainville and Fritz Martin making a side trip to see the Cannonball Run coming through Wheels Through Time Museum. Fritz supplied this report:

This year the Cannonball Coast to Coast Endurance Race took place from September 7th to 24th 2023. The route was 3,800 miles from Virginia Beach, VA. to Oceanside, CA. . The Motorcycle Cannonball is the most difficult antique endurance run in the world since the 1900s, when Erwin "Cannonball" Baker crossed the country in the USA. This year 77 riders started in Virginia Beach with their bikes allowed only pre 1933! Many of them surely had only a vague idea of what challenges will lay ahead. So did our Italian friends from Patina Garage, Fabio Costamagna, Christiano Pelganta and Luca Geron. Two years of preparing were necessary to be at the starting line.

On September 10th the Stage #3 Route took the Cannonball Riders along curvy roads through the Chimney Rock State Park and Lake Lure in the Blue Ridge Mountains. They stopped for a lunch break at the Wheels through Time Museum in North Carolina, where a huge crowd awaited them. Among them were Olivier Blainville from France and Fritz Martin from Germany, both good friends of our Italian Riders. What a surprise for Fabio, Christiano and Luca to meet their European friends here in the USA during the Race!

At the end, they did a very good job, no penalty and a perfect score which brought them to position 24, 25 and 50 in Oceanside, CA. Congratulation guys, really well done for their first time!



Here is Fabio's 1930 Harley VL, which we last saw at the top of a mountain pass when I rode it in June on the Italy/France Road Run. These old flatheads are popular long distance mounts.

Normandy Beach Racing 22-24 September

Again we have a report from Fritz Martin:

Beach racing is one of the oldest disciplines in all of motorsports. Way back in 1902 motorcyclists took their bikes to the sand of Daytona Beach for racing in FL, USA. This was happening also in 2023, 22th to 24th September at the Normandy Beach Race on the legendary Sword Beach in Normandy, France.

The Normandy Beach Race is open only to pre 1947 motorcycles and cars with 1/8 mile drag races. It's 4th edition this year again brought an incredible huge mass of enthusiasts to the beach, what a show! Racers from all over Europe joined the race. The 3 founders Jean-Marc, Jean and Thomas also welcome a racing star from the USA; Brittney Olsen came to the race with her husband Matt and son Lock. They had a really unique experience with a surprising 3 day program on the beach.

Spectacular races on Saturday and Sunday, even at night thrilled and infatuated the racers as well as the spectators. If you missed this, Normandy Beach Race will invite you again in 2025.





UK Pioneer Run 01 October

This London to Brighton Run for pre-1915 motorcycles was held for the $83^{\rm rd}$ time, with 150 entries somewhat up on the rain-soaked 2022 event.

AMM Swap Meet 01 October

On the same day as the Pioneer Run, the American Motorcycle Museum in Raalte held a small swap meet. Martin van Kuijk reports brisk trading Saturday afternoon and Sunday, and here is a picture of visitors checking out trade stands packed with spare parts for American bikes.



Mannheim Meet 13-15 October

This is the big meet in Germany which closes out our swap meet season. This time Martin van Kuijk and Claudia Krause reported our biggest ever AMCA stand at 30 metres, say 100 feet, with stand holders from France, Spain, Germany and the Netherlands.

This time the weather was good, hot and sunny Friday and Saturday with a little rain on Sunday. All our members are reported as having had a good time!

Denton AMCA Meet 13-15 October

I was there to supervise the judging, and expected three fine days from my weather forecast. In the event, Thursday morning was damp and Saturday wet enough for indoor judging, but we put on a good show on Friday. I had attended the first Denton Meet when it was in the spring, but now it closes out our season and is much larger. There are different parts and different people compared with the East Coast Meets, and the locals put on a good show of southern hospitality.

Our new Board member Mike Bruso organised the chopper show as theme of the Meet, and I saw thirty or forty ridden in and showing off awesome artistic and practical skills. Sponsors had provided cash prizes, and Luther Zimmerman took \$500 with this 1947 U Harley flathead chopper judged by peoples choice.



Our pal Rocky Halter was delighted to take second prize of \$250 with this tasteful 1937 Indian Chief:



Some of the milder entrants could have been entered as Period Modified for Chapter awards, but this was not to be. Meanwhile we were judging 39 entries from 12 different marques, with these ones catching my eye. This 1968 Indian Super Scout took most unique:



This is one of about 39 built by West Coast dealer Sammy Pierce with an eye-catching metalflake red fiberglass tank/seat over used Scout parts in a 1949 Warrior frame. Custom and cool!

Among the Harleys, this 1946 knuckle was entered by the daughter of the original owner and did well.



And this last year 1965 Topper looked good:



While this 1981 Laverda Jota shows that we are now judging a lot of 1970s and 1980s motorcycles:



At the Saturday banquet, I said a few words about European legislation encroaching on our rights to ride old motorcycles, and Keith Kizer put in some good words for FIVA who are lobbying on our behalf. Bruce Palmer, author of How to Restore Your Harley-Davidson was then given the 2024 Legend award by the Legends Chapter, part of the coalition sponsoring the Meet. Bruce then talked about his introduction to old bikes and answered questions. Here's me with Bruce and Debbie Palmer and Bruce Linsday earlier in the show:



Wheels Through Time 15/16 October

As I was already in North Carolina, I took an extra day to visit the WTT museum. Matt Walksler has done a lot to the place since my last visit, including a tasteful tribute to his Dad Dale. Floor managers Andy and Jake entertained me with a tour, which of course involved starting up some of the motorcycles. I was there to check up on my CHP 1936 VLH pursuit bike, which was being carefully looked after:



This will go to Mecum in Vegas early next year if not sold earlier. The next morning I had the pleasure of working with Mike Lange and Matt in stripping down a flooded 1939 UL filled with mud after a flood. We had the motor out and the cases split in two hours:



You might just see me in a WTT video but that was a lot of fun before leaving for Charlotte airport.
